In addition, he served twelve years as a representative on the United States Olympic Committee (USOC). In 2005, he was honored for his outstanding efforts as the recipient of the Hershey's STRIVE Award as the National Youth Sports Administrator of the Year. He has been inducted into the Western Pennsylvania Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and received the prestigious Jewish Hall of Fame Ziggy Kahn Award. He is currently the CEO of Henry Kaufman Camp Grounds, offering camping services and programs to over 18 agencies in the Greater New York and Long Island communities.
